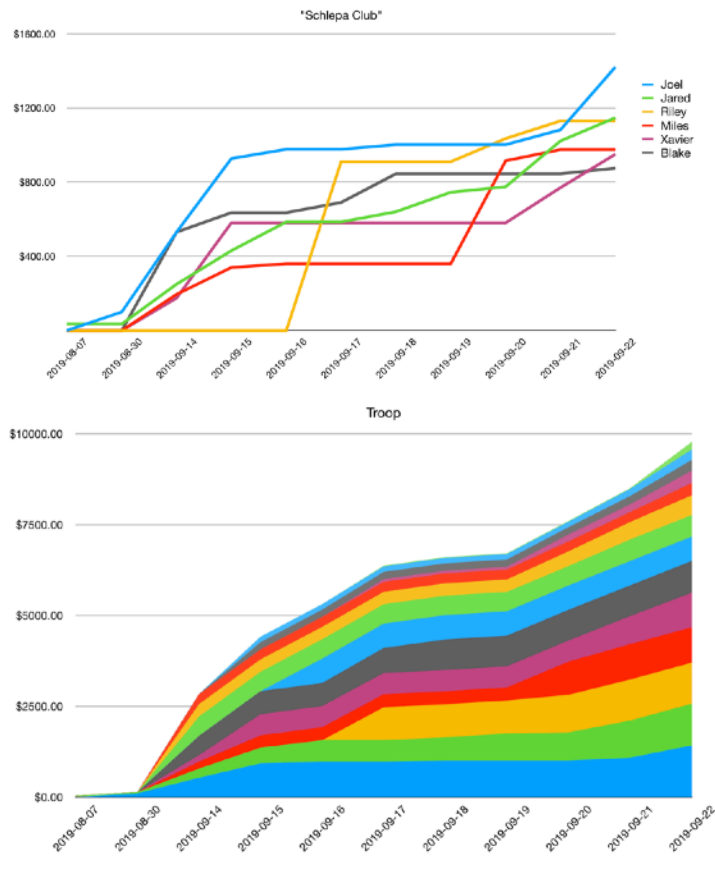

Scouters, Scouts, Parents, and Guardians - Greenery Sales are about to begin!

I know it sounds early, but in keeping with the spirit of Hallmark, Lowes and the Home Depot, it's never too early to start rolling out the Holiday decorations!

For those new to the Troop and/or not familiar with this program, the Troop sells fresh Holiday Greenery items (Wreaths, Garland, Centerpieces, Door Swag, etc...) as an additional way for Scouts to earn funds for their Scout Accounts and the Troop.

For those interested in selling Greenery, we will have Order Forms and Product Information available at the Troop Meeting starting on September 30th, and any time after that. If your Scout needs additional forms, or decides later that they would like to sell, we will have forms available up until the Order deadline. You can also e-mail or stop me with any additional questions.

The two programs offered for sales include a general Group Delivery, where we order in bulk and your Scout will deliver directly to customers, or the Direct Delivery, where the product is sent directly to the home specified by the customer (great gift idea for out of town family and friends) for an additional cost. Please note the price differences and separate order forms for each. If and when Direct Delivery orders are made, please make sure you have the full name and address for where the product is to be delivered.

Order forms will be accepted no later than the Monday Troop Meeting on October 28th. Placing the Final Order that week ensures us a Final Delivery Window of November 20th through November 26th, just before Thanksgiving weekend. Once the Bulk Group Delivery items are delivered to us and sorted, we will notify those who sold for pick up at our house. Typically the Direct Delivery items are sent to the customers the first or second week after Thanksgiving.

As some are aware, since the Group items are ordered by the case, we typically have extra product available that we will want sold after the fact, to prevent the Troop from having to eat the cost of those items. Once we know what and the number of extras we have, I will let you know. I will be making efforts to keep the extras at a minimum; however, sometimes this is unavoidable.

We will also be collecting payment along with the Order forms (again, no later than Monday, October 28th). I would strongly suggest collecting payment up front at the time of sales, particularly for the Direct Delivery items, as this makes the final delivery go more smoothly. Checks are to be made out to Troop 308.

Please contact me if you have any additional questions. My e-mails are being forwarded by Mr. Feldman due to communication limitations I have been having through Scoutbook. Scouts, in keeping with Youth Protection, if you e-mail me, please CC your parents.
