Beginning in August 1, 2023, all parents attending campouts will need YPT up-to-date AND fill out an application for a troop leadership position. Every adult who camps must be registered. Please stay up-to-date with Youth Protection Training (YPT). It must be completed every 2 years, and do not let it expire! It is much easier to renew training than to restart the YPT process. Contact Susan Harrison with questions regarding required application paperwork.

Please request Scoutmaster conferences. August 21st is the last day for a Scoutmaster conference for rank advancement prior to the September 11th Court of Honor. Last day for Board of Review is August 28th. Please make sure advancements achieved at summer camp are recorded and signed off. Scouts should record all campouts, service projects, hiking, etc. in their scout book and ask an adult leader to update this information in Scoutbook.
